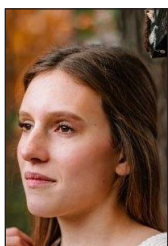

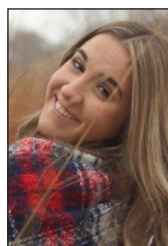

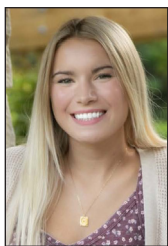

Ida Public Schools recognized as a higher growth district during COVID

FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

Dear Ida Public Schools Community:

Based on data from the 2020-21 school year (heart of COVID-19), the Michigan Department of Education, assisted by EPIC and MSU, identified Ida Public Schools as a higher growth district in Michigan during the pandemic. Their findings were not based on Ida's tradition of solid achievement scores which continued throughout COVID. These findings were based on the rate of growth surpassing expected achievement and other benchmarks determined by the MDE. In my interview with the research analyst, I stressed we worked as a team to survive and then thrive during COVID-19. It took all of us, the parents, students, and staff. From the start, we developed a collaborative framework and educational options based on surveys, team meetings, instructional needs, and local health data. We continued this process throughout, communicating information and updates, and adjusting infrastructures as the challenges of COVID increased and then waned. All these efforts went into our students not experiencing the learning loss that was predicted for students during COVID, instead showing marked higher growth. Our goal throughout was keeping children in school, with the options that parents were comfortable with, without putting their children at a risk greater than what the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, our health official, mandated, and the parents and staff deemed safe. Parents, thank you for partnering with us.

TRANSPORTATION EZ-ROUTING - Parent Portal

Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, all students needing school bus transportation will be required to register. A district wide communication will be sent out prior to registration beginning. More details to follow.

Bond Update

FROM THE SCHOOL BOARD, BUILDING TASK TEAM AND BUILDING COMMITTEE

Dear Ida Public Schools Taxpayers:

The Ida Board of Education, in collaboration with the Building Task Team and the Building Committee, recommended and approved an updated bond proposal for the August 2, 2022 ballot.

After our bond attempt in November, the Building Task Team, The Building Committee, and the Ida Board of Education sought feedback as to why it did not pass. Using this information, these groups re-evaluated and revised the bond proposal. All groups agreed, the need does not go away. As shared in the Superintendent Brief in January, we are on borrowed time. [Superintendent Brief January 31, 2022.](#)

Ida Public Schools secures 2 mills each year from the general budget to take care of manageable projects which is not enough to take care of the bigger ticket items, especially when all buildings were built within 14 years of each other. We will continue to seek a bond to meet those needs.

Hopefully you will take time to go over the questions and answers (Q and A) on our website. If your questions or concerns are not addressed in the Q and A, contact the superintendent, another member of the building committee or consider attending one of the parent meetings.

Truth be told, economy wise, there is never a good time to propose a bond, one that has been needed for the past 10-15 years for safety and security, and our heating systems alone. We still have one middle school classroom waiting, as of 4/28/22, for parts to be made and is still functioning with portable heaters.

Even though our superintendent retires in June, the facility study was conducted by experts and the decision making by three groups, the Building Task Team, the Building Committee and the Board of Education. It is not dependent on who the superintendent is. The current in-depth facility study, that took 10 months to complete, is a view for the next 30 years and is the districts strategic facility plan.

Thank you in advance for your consideration of this proposal and what we could do together for our kids, grandkids, and neighbors.

Elementary School

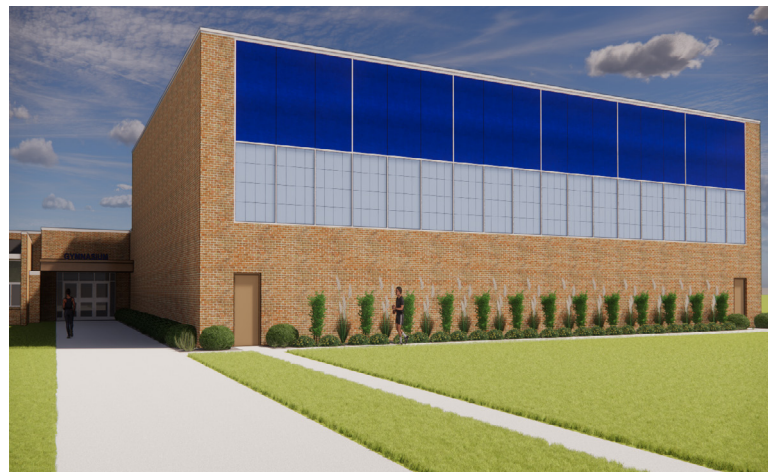
- PreK education expansion

- Replace one 47 year old boiler and all piping (Piping is original 72-years old)
- Replace all unit ventilators (Current units are original and replacement parts not available)
- New playgrounds
- New lockers and LED lighting and controls
- Multi-purpose room/full size gym addition for curriculum and after hour athletic, rec and community use

Middle School

- Update 6/7/8th grade science labs


